Draft Minutes of the Meeting

Attendance

The eighteenth meeting of the Ad Hoc Faculty Senate GAI Committee convened at 1:34 p.m. on October 30, 2025, in Room 135F of Thomas Boyd Hall on the LSU campus, with the Chair, Vice Chair, and Secretary present. No public comments were offered.

Capra-Ribeiro made a motion to approve the minutes from the previous meeting on October 23, 2025. The motion was seconded and approved unanimously.

The first item on New Business was the Faculty Senate Presentation regarding the GAI Committee's work on the AI Adoption Curriculum Guidelines, which will be presented at the FS meeting on November 3, 2025. The presentation will have the following structure:

- Introduction of FS GAI Committee members
- The scope and background general information
- Guidelines for students
- Guidelines for faculty and staff
- Challenges of GAI and syllabi statements
- Summary and wrap-up, future plans and request for Ad Hoc GAI Committee to be a standing committee

The second item on New Business was about the Discussion on Grammarly. Norton highlighted Grammarly's authorship tool for process transparency and source citation. Members acknowledged its potential but raised concerns over AI-detection limitations, data privacy, subscription costs, and faculty opposition to AI. Further, the tool does not help those faculty who prohibit use of Grammarly and GAI in courses. The overall consensus was (1) outright bans are unenforceable due to limitations of AI detection tools and (2) focus should shift to solutions and resources for adopting AI in courses. Committee members discussed whether Grammarly could be positioned as a viable middle-path tool with opt-out provisions for training data. As the next step, the Committee may discuss Grammarly in December meeting with structured debate.

Lee moved to adjourn the meeting, which was approved unanimously. The meeting adjourned at 2:35
