Draft Minutes of the Meeting

Attendance

The eleventh meeting of the Ad Hoc Faculty Senate GAI Committee convened at 1:35pm on September 11, 2025, in room 135F of Thomas Boyd Hall at the LSU campus, with the Chair and the Secretary being present. No public comments were offered.

Norton made a motion to approve the minutes from the previous meeting on May 23, 2025. The motion was moved and unanimously approved.

There were no Chair's updates.

The Committee meeting began with the first New Business item: Elections for the Vice Chair and the Secretary positions. The Chair provided background, noting the Faculty Senate Executive Committee's decision to hold officer elections for each committee. The Chair elections will take place in the spring and Vice Chair and Secretary elections will occur in the fall. Schoegl made a motion to hold elections for the Vice Chair and Secretary positions, which was seconded and passed unanimously. There were no additional nominations made for Vice Chair candidates, and the motion to close nominations by Osborn was passed unanimously.

Two candidates, Fabio Capra-Ribeiro and Seungwon Yang, were nominated for Vice Chair. Each had an opportunity to make a brief statement. Capra-Ribeiro received five votes, Yang had one vote, and there were three abstentions recorded during the Committee's vote. Capra-Ribeiro was elected Vice Chair.

The Chair opened nominations for the Secretary position. Tyagi nominated the current Secretary, Yang, who accepted the nomination. Norton moved to close nominations, which was passed unanimously. As the sole candidate, Yang was elected Secretary.

The second New Business item was the Curriculum Guidelines. The Committee discussed the need for further revisions to enhance coherence and consistency, as well as integration with IT guidelines. The Committee also discussed challenges in implementing the Guidelines for three AI adoption options: AI prohibited in classes, AI fully permitted, and AI allowed with specific instructions.

The discussion subjects included: a) Providing AI-generated text detection tools to instructors; b) Accuracy limitations of these tools; c) Potential disagreements between faculty and the LSU Student Advocacy & Accountability (SAA) office due to b); d) Lack of enforcement mechanisms for violations of AI use policies; e) Risks for falsely accusing students of plagiarism due to b); and f) The needs for new AI-integrated assignments in courses.

The third item of the New Business, Research Guidelines, was not discussed during this meeting.

Schoegl and Norton will lead the revision of the Curriculum Guidelines and the rest of the Committee will then join.

Osborn made a motion to adjourn, which was moved and passed unanimously.

The meeting adjourned at 2:39pm.
